HC3 in Maths + OD3/HD3 in one of Physics, Chemistry, Physics with Chemistry, Engineering, Technology, Technical Drawing/Design & Communication Graphics, Biology, Agricultural Science or OB3/HD3 Maths + HC3 in one of Applied Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Physics with Chemistry, Biology, Agricultural Science. (Agricultural Science has been added to this final group).

(e) Special Mathematics Examination

The Special Mathematics Examination has been extended to cover entry to **all** programmes offered by the Faculty of Science & Engineering. This examination is for students who achieve sufficient CAO entry points and satisfy all other entrance requirements, but who do not achieve the requisite grade in Mathematics in the Leaving Certificate.
