(Hons) 4-year degree shares some modules with the programmes in Sport and Exercise with Performance, and Sport and Exercise with Physical Education. Included modules to enable students to gain the REPS Ireland (Register of Exercise Professionals) awards. Year 3 includes a work placement in a clinical environment; Year 4 includes a clinical research project. ARTI accreditation of the programme is pending. When achieved it will enable students to sit the ARTI examination and qualify as a Certified Athletic Therapist.

An Important note for candidates born outside the EU.

Relevant for Courses that require Garda Vetting and for Fee Determination for all courses

LYIT has a number of courses for which Garda (police) Vetting is required. Typically, these are courses during which students are likely to go on placement that may involve them working with children and/or vulnerable adults during the course of their studies. Where Garda Vetting is required, registration cannot be completed and students cannot go on placement until such time as they have successfully completed the vetting procedure. For this reason, nonEU candidates will only be considered any course that requires Garda Vetting if places still remain vacant after all qualified EU candidates have been considered.

Applicants born outside the EU but claiming EU nationality who are applying for courses requiring Garda Vetting will be required to provide evidence of Eu Status.

This is important for two reasons.

If they cannot indicate EU status they will not be considered for any course requiring Garda Vetting.

nonEU status may have an impact on the fees that apply for all course.

New Entrant Sports Scholarships, €1,000. Applicants must be a member of a GAA County football or hurling panel or a member of a League of Ireland soccer panel. Applications will also be considered from anyone who has played Basketball for Ireland at underage level.

Sports Scholarships for registered students, awarded during semester 2, €1,000 of €1,500 depending on whether full or developmental,

REACH Scholarship aimed primarily at those with disability and financial limitation, Interview in June. **€800** per year for additional maths and communication support.

Optum HealthCare Scholarship aimed at increasing diversity in higher education. Applications are sent directly to Optum not to LYIT.

1916 Scholarships – Part of the National Access Plan to increase diversity, target first time entrants who qualify for from socio economically disadvantaged who are eligible for the highest level of SUSI grant and are in receipt of means tested DSP social welfare payment. **€5,000** per year for each year of undergraduate study.

Clubs & Socs Awards night. LYIT has a wide range of clubs and societies. At a annual gala dinner various bursaries are distributed to recognise achievement with the clubs and societies for volunteering, civic engagement, community and charity work and leadership.

Sanctuary Scholarships aimed at those in direct provision, up to 3 annually, priority given to those in Direct Provision.
