**CAO release 2022 course choices data**

The Central Applications Office (CAO) has released 2022 application data up to the Change of Course Choices closing date of 1 March.

The data shows applications by course classification, course level and by applicant address.

78,012 applications were received by CAO by the 1 February closing date – a decrease of 1,164 applicants on the previous year.

There was a total of 6,587 applications from applicants over 23 years of age – down 2,140 (-24.5%) applications from 2021.

8,713 applicants indicated that they wish to be considered for the Disability Access Route to Education (DARE) – an increase of 874 from last year.

A total of 9,247 applicants indicated that they wish to be considered for the Higher Education Access Route (HEAR) – a decrease of 769 from 2021.

Final numbers for DARE HEAR applicants will not be known until after the 15 March deadline for receipt of supporting documentation.

The data provided at this stage is interim data and is subject to change when late applications are taken into account and when the Change of Mind facility closes on 1 July at 5pm.

Speaking about the application figures, head of communications for CAO, Eileen Keleghan, commented: “The majority of CAO applicants will be permitted to use the Change of Mind facility when it opens on 5 May to add, remove or re-order course choices, which will result in changes to the figures released today.

**Notes to the Editor:**

- The CAO uses the International Standard Classification of Education for Fields of Education and Training 2013 (ISCED-F). All CAO courses have been assigned one ISCED-F code. In addition, in order to reflect previous subject categories and particular groups, the CAO has implemented a specialist group classification. This specialist group classification is completely separate to the ISCED-F classification and not all courses will be in a specialist group, however, it is possible for a course to be in two specialist groups.

- There are limitations to the year-on-year data comparisons by course classification due to the introduction or cancellation of courses, and as a result of some courses being re-classified by the HEI. The statistical category for each course is given in the accompanying spreadsheet.
- The address data is broken down by the address given on the application – these are grouped: county in Republic of Ireland, Northern Ireland, Britain, Other EU countries and other Non-EU countries.
- 203 of the 78,012 applicants were Advanced Entry applicants only. The CAO processes applications for entry to years 2, 3 and 4 of undergraduate courses in some Irish Higher Education Institutions (HEIs). This entry route is known as Advanced Entry.
- The final DARE/HEAR completed application numbers will not be known until after all the documents have been received (after 15 March) and the screening of that information is complete.
